

Why Do We Have a Board of Directors?

Membership on the Board of Directors is an unpaid elected position. Board members serve two-year terms beginning July 1, after elections held in Feb-March.

The Board of Directors meets once or more each month on the last and first (if needed) Wednesdays at 5:00pm at the SBTA office. The Board is comprised of the following 16 elected persons:

- President
- Vice President
- Treasurer
- Secretary
- Elementary members
- Middle school members
- High school members
- Special services member

The Board of Directors serves as follows:

- Establish Standing Rules for itself, the bargaining team, and all committees
- Act upon all documents, instructions, and contracts in the name of SBTA
- Review, consider and recommend the regular budget and additional expenditures to the Representative Council for approval
- Administer and direct special funds of SBTA
- Act as the UniServe board
- Direct the grievance processing of SBTA
- Direct bargaining activities and recommend of remove Bargaining Team members per the bylaws
- Exercise all the business and organizational powers and duties for SBTA
- All members must attend regularly scheduled meetings
- Review the PAGE (political action) committee's recommendations and forward them to the Representative Council with a recommendation to approve, disapprove, or no recommendation
